Rules on the use of fireworks passed by the Stonegate Community Association Board of Directors at its meeting on January 25, 2011.

Fireworks prohibited on common areas

The use of fireworks or any low explosive pyrotechnic devices used for aesthetic and entertainment purposes is prohibited in accordance with 3.16 Health, Safety and Welfare, of the Stonegate CC&Rs. Homeowners found to be responsible for the party who ignites said device in Stonegate common areas, defined as streets, Community Center, recreational area and other ancillary Stonegate buildings, tennis courts, landscape areas and natural washes, shall be subject to a fine of \$500 as set by the Board of Directors.

Fireworks prohibited on residential lots

The use of fireworks or any low explosive pyrotechnic devices used for aesthetic and entertainment purposes is prohibited in accordance with <u>3.6 Nuisances</u> and <u>3.16 Health, Safety and Welfare,</u> of the Stonegate CC&Rs. Homeowners must contain the usage of such items on their property (i.e., markings from incineration of device), not to exceed the height of privacy walls and not to become excessively visible or audible to neighboring properties. Homeowners violating this rule shall be subject to a \$100 fine per incident as set by the Board of Directors. For damages to Common Areas, restitution charges will be assessed to property owner/homeowner. Any property owner/homeowner will have the right to appeal, as established by the Boart of Directors.
